- 2) To reach the KEY CHANGER pages click the (faded) KEY CHANGER DINOSAUR icon (or the XMAS KEY CHANGER icon)
- 3) The following details concentrate on the main KEY CHANGER programme the XMAS KEY CHANGER works in an identical way.
- 4) Here is the KEY CHANGER main index page:



- 5) Notice that the middle DINOSUAR icon is now clear and the pdf link has 'KC' on it (this document).
- 6) To get back to the MAIN INDEX click the faded DINOSAUR UKE.
- 7) To get to the XMAS KEY CHANGER click the faded red-hatted tree!
- 8) The KEY CHANGER index works differently from the other index only one set of songs at a time is shown to start with this will be the 'A' section as shown above.
- 9) The TOP button is useful if you scroll down the song list a long way it brings you straight back to the top.

- 10) To see the other songs click 'B', 'C', etc to display those sections
- 11) The filter icon takes you to special collections: Artists / Theme Night / Irish / Christmas/ War / Music Hall / Vaudeville / The ABC choices are hidden for these collections click the ABC icon to go back to them.





12)The Current SongList, heart (Favourites) and Set List icons lead to special lists which are explained <u>later:</u>



13) The other icons are a TUNER
(for high-g and low-G ukes or guitar);
each note sounds 10 times.
DICE (for a random song),
REFRESH PAGE (always a good idea)
and KC USER MANUAL (this document)






- 14) The Backup and Restore features are explained in a separate pdf
- 15) The Settings section is dealt with lower down this document





16) From the ABC index click 'Ain't Misbehavin' and you get this screen – the drop down menus are hidden until you press the main line icons – the key, **aA**, the chord frame or the 'prison bars' column selector icon. The favourites and Set List icons are explained later.



- 18) If a chords box is closed click its icon for display- click CLOSE to hide it.
- 19) Chord panels can be dragged around the screen by mouse or touch and the chords are presented in the order they appear in the song I think it is easier to find each one quickly that way (better than alphabetical order). The 'chords' in RED DOTS are the first 2 notes of the song (to jog your memory!).
- 20) You can choose among 3 text sizes click the **aA** icon – each song opens in the middle size and that's probably OK most of the time. For 'long' songs (eg Hotel California) the small text might be better. For 'short' songs you might like the largest text size. And if you use COLUMNS (see below) you may need to adjust the text size.
- 21) Sing the first couple of lines while playing the chords offered and it might feel comfortable fine job done finish the song.
- 22) But if it feels a bit too low try moving it to D (Bm) by clicking key icon and then the letter D (Bm) in the drop down the yellow background jumps to D (Bm) and the chords change in the song and in the chord grid. And off you go singing



again trying other keys until you find the key that suits you the best.


23) When you want to try another song ('59th Street Bridge Song' ?? - that's groovy!) just click and off you go again.

- 24) The dice gives you a random song from the collection.

 Random songs display in 3 columns with the middle font size.


 You can of course alter this
- 25) The 'heart plus' icon lets you add the current song to your Favourites list see later section for details.
- 26) The 'TO DO plus' icon let's you add the current song to a set list useful if you need a list of songs together.
- 27) Some songs have a blue 'flash' next to them in the index.

 This shows that they have uke tablature for an INTRO
 or a SOLO these are KEY SPECIFIC so they vanish if you change key.
 To get them back select the initial key again.



- 28) The INTRO/SOLO panel can be dragged around the screen by mouse or touch.
- 29) You can select up to 6 coumns for the display click the 'prison bars' to see the drop down menu. This facility (along with judicious use of the TEXT SIZE choices) allows you to adjust your view to its largest/most comfortable setting.






- 30) All songs can be scrolled some people hate this but others find it useful and to initiate scrolling you click the SCROLL icon to display the SCROLL CHOICES bar.
- 31) You can't scroll with several columns showing so the display goes straight to a single column view.
- 32) a Stop scrolling hide panel.
 - b Start scrolling and alter speed (shown in strip and next to song title) by clicking the rainbow panel higher or lower.




c Pause scrolling



- c Continue scrolling
- d Keep scrolling but jump to top of page
- e Keep scrolling but jump up the page a bit
- f Keep scrolling but jump down the page a bit
- g Scrolling pauses its start for about 5 seconds you can start singing and have a bit of a 'headstart'. The 'thermometer' shows progess of the pause period.
- 33) If you can see the left-right arrows when your song displays, then you can move on to the next song on your list, or back to the previous song the number shows how far through the list you are:





CURRENT SONGS – FAVOURITES – SET LIST

34) As you look at songs they are automatically added to a CURRENT SONGS list – list list shows songs in the order you visited them; up to 33 songs are stored; after that the last song on the list is pushed off the end! You can DELETE this list and start again if you wish by clicking the 'waste paper bin' icon and selecting YES:

37) The XMAS KEY CHANGER has the same functionality as above – the only difference is its menu structure:



- 38) The first 'faded' dinosaur takes you back to the MAIN INDEX page; the second takes you to the KEY CHANGER page.
- 39) Notice that the third 'DINOSAUR' is in fact a Christmas Tree very clear to show where you are.
- 40) The DICE gives a random Xmas song; REFRESH PAGE is always a good idea; and KC USER MANUAL links to this doument.
- 41)The MUG XMAS section has songs from the Marlow Ukulele Group collection; the NYC XMAS section has the New York Christmas collection from Jenny Selig; and OTHER XMAS covers songs from the Eyam Uke Group. ABC takes you back to the alphabetical index

CURRENT SONG LIST, FAVOURITES and Set list



- 42) As you look at songs they are automatically added to a CURRENT SONGS list list list shows songs in the order you visited them; up to 33 songs are stored; after that the last song on the list is pushed off the end! Songs are saved in their original key.
- 43) As you approach the 33 song limit an extra image appears and if you click it you see a brief message:



44) You can clear the entire list and start again by clicking the waste basket icon and its associated warning popup:





MY FAVOURITES - add current song to list?

- 45) On each song display page there is an 'Add to Favourites' icon:
 Clicking this leads to a popup allowing you to add the current song to your
 Favourites list where you can say 'YES' (adds song to list), 'NO' (leaves
 Favourites list unchanged) or 'X' (closes the popup).
- 46) If you have changed the song key then this is saved so the song opens in the new key from the FAVOURITES list. Opening the song from the ABC list keeps the original key. If you change **font size** or **columns** then these changes are also saved.






- 47) There is an 'Add to Set List' icon ('TO DO') with similar functionality:
- 48) The SET LIST is likely to change much more frequently than your list of FAVOURITES
- 49) You access each list from the KEY CHANGER main menu by clicking either the HEART or the TO DO icon:



50) Then you can click a song name (as normal) to display it.



51) If you can see the left-right arrows when your song displays, then you can move on to the next song on your list, or back to the previous song – the number shows how far through the list you are:



52) Or for either list you can CLEAR the list (DELETE ALL) or EDIT the list (delete songs one at a time).

Clicking the 'heart waste basket' or to do basket' icon will let you delete ALL favourites / set list items – after responding to a warning popup:




53) If you only want to delete one particular song you can edit the list by clicking the 'heart pencil' icon or the 'to do pencil' icon...





- 54) Click the song you want to remove from the list you see a warning popup confirming the selected song name. 'YES' removes the song and displays a new list without it. 'NO' cancels the process.
- 55) On the SET LIST page you have an extra 'Change Cells' icon:



56) This allows you to change the order of SET LIST items. When you click the Change Cells icon you are shown a purple grid of 12 cells where each song can be moved around by mouse drag or touch drag:

57) As you start dragging the cell with the dashed border will take your song if you drop it there. You can drag and drop to a filled cell also, in which case the songs swap places.



58) Move songs around until you are happy with the order – than press the green tick to save the new SET LIST. No need to tidy them up – the SAVE does that for you!

SETTINGS PANEL

- 59) You have already seen that you can manually alter the columns, text size etc for individual songs. The SETTINGS panel lets you save a default view of 3 elements whenever a new song opens.
- 60) Click the SETTINGS cog wheel to open the section which is a small window with a scroll bar giving access to three areas of control:
 - CHORDS ORIENTATION
 - VERTICAL or HORIZONTAL DISPLAY
 - FONT SIZE
 - Small, Medium or Large
 - NUMBER of COLUMNS
 - 1 6
- 61) You will only see the top section and a half to begin with scroll down for the last section
- 62) The purple background shows the current selection of display variables. Here they show **VERTICAL** chord display, **LARGE** font size and **FOUR** columns.
- 63) Make your own preferred choices and close the panel choices are automatically saved and reloaded next time you start the programme.
- 64) You can still make changes to any song you are looking at wthout altering the defaults you set here.
- 65) You can reset the **SETTINGS** as often as you wish.
